Mark Griffon

Mark Griffon was nominated by President Barack Obama to the U.S. Chemical Safety Board in March 2010 and confirmed by the Senate in June, 2010. He operated a consultant business which, for the last 18 years, focused on occupational and environmental health. His consulting work included large plant exposure assessments at several Department of Energy sites, environmental clean-up work and technical assistance and audits regarding industrial hygiene and health physics issues. Prior to his consultancy he worked at the University of Massachusetts Lowell Toxics Use Reduction Institute. Additionally, Mr. Griffon was appointed to serve as a member of the Federal Advisory Board on Radiation and Worker Health to advise the National Institute of Occupational Health on the compensation program. Mr. Griffon has a B.S. in Chemistry from Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute and an M.S. in Radiological Sciences from University of Massachusetts Lowell.
